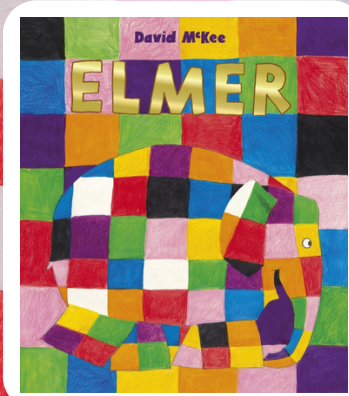

the inside.

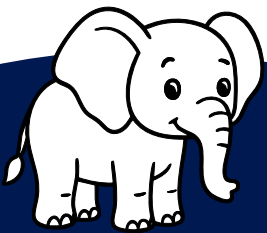
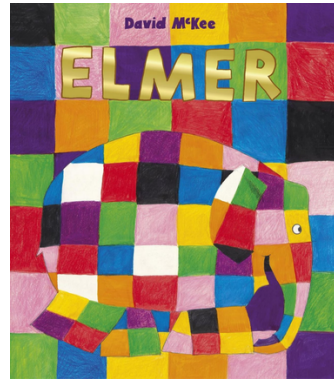
The Friendship Heart

“Berry Wash” station

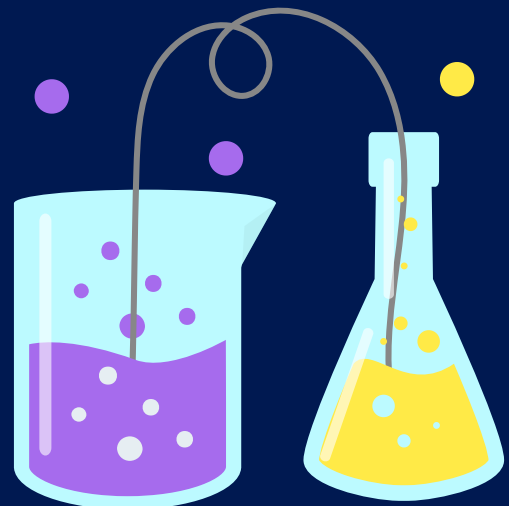
Cover a plastic elephant in washable grey paint or mud. Give your child a spray bottle of water or a sponge - as they “rain” on the elephant, the grey layer will dissolve to reveal the colours underneath!

No-Mess Colour Mixing

Squirt two different primary colours of paint into a ziploc bag. Encourage your child to squish the bag with their fingers to see the colours mix into a new one - creating a secondary colour.

Wet Chalk “Melting” Art

Dip chalk sticks into water before drawing, the colours will go on thick like paint - you can do this on paper or pavement. Add another colour on top and use your finger to “melt” the two together.

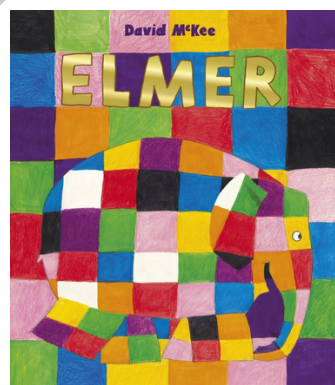

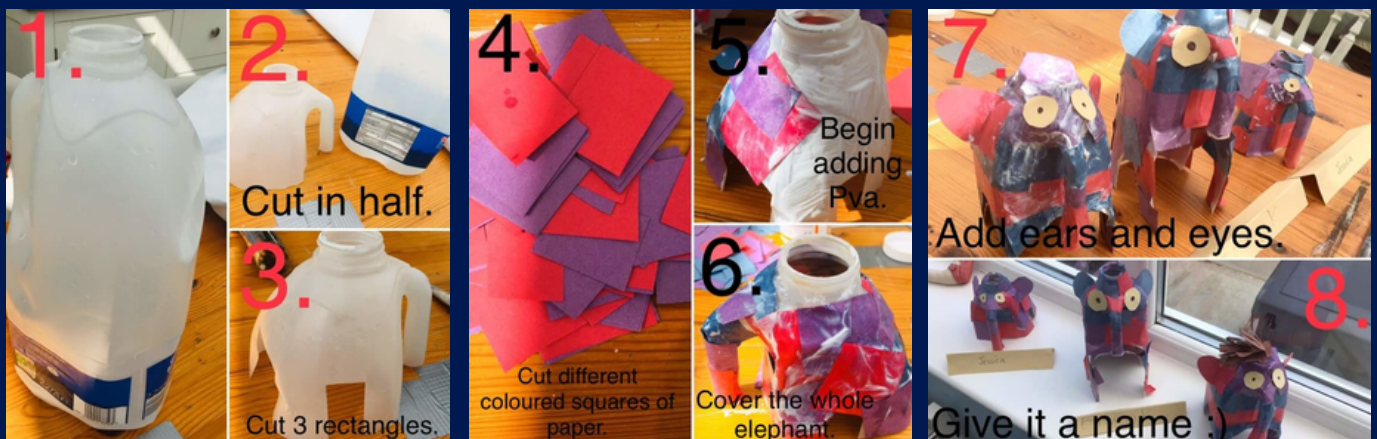
